Keeping Safe during Coronavirus

In order for families to remain safe, we would like to remind parents, guardians and carers that if your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) such as a high temperature, a new, continuous cough, and/or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste, please book a PCR test and stay at home until you get your test results - only leave your home to get tested.

Parents, guardians and carers should ensure that they leave children who have tested positive at home and do not attempt to bring them onto the School site to collect other children from school. Urgent Mental Health Support - 24/7 Crisis Lines

Children, young people and their families can access free help, advice and urgent mental health support from 24/7 crisis telephone lines available in every London borough. Applying for Secondary School September 2022

We would like to inform all parents, guardians and carers of children born between 1st September 2010 and 31st August 2011 that the closing date for applications for Secondary School places to be received by the London Borough of Hillingdon, by post or online, is **Sunday 31st October 2021**.

To ensure your application arrives on time and in order to give your child the best possible chance of being offered the school of your choice, we would advise that you submit your applications no later than Friday 22nd October to ensure that it is received by the published deadline. Primary School Admissions 2022

We would like to inform all parents, guardians and carers of children born between 1st September 2017 and 31st August 2018 that the closing date for applications for Primary School places to be received by the London Borough of Hillingdon, by post or online, is midnight on **Saturday 15th January 2022**.

To ensure your application arrives on time and in order to give your child the best possible chance of being offered the school of your choice, we would advise that you submit your applications prior to the Christmas holiday period. The London Borough of Hillingdon states on their website that they cannot be held responsible for any delays in applications due to problems with postal or Internet service providers.



At Hewens Primary School, we will be honouring the contributions made to society by people of Back heritage and their communities by taking part in various activities and competitions throughout the month. **Key Stage 1 pupils** will learn about a famous Black Briton and their achievements or contributions to British society. The suggested personalities include: Sir Trevor McDonald, Mary Seacole, Mo Farah, Lewis Hamilton, Claudia Jones, Benjamin Zephaniah, Lenny Henry. **Key Stage 2 will be taught** to understand the experiences and contributions of people from communities across the United Kingdom. On Wednesday 20th October, we will then host a special celebration assembly at 1:30pm in the Quad to commemorate Black History Month.

We will end the month's celebrations by hosting an Alliance Quiz Competition for Years 1 to 6. Please encourage your child to participate in the activities and raise awareness of Black History Month.

National Bullying Prevention Month

National Bullying Prevention Month is a month-long event to prevent childhood bullying and promote kindness, acceptance and inclusion. At Hewens Primary School, we all have a role to play whether we are children, parents, guardians or carers, teachers or school administrators.
