## Red Nose Day

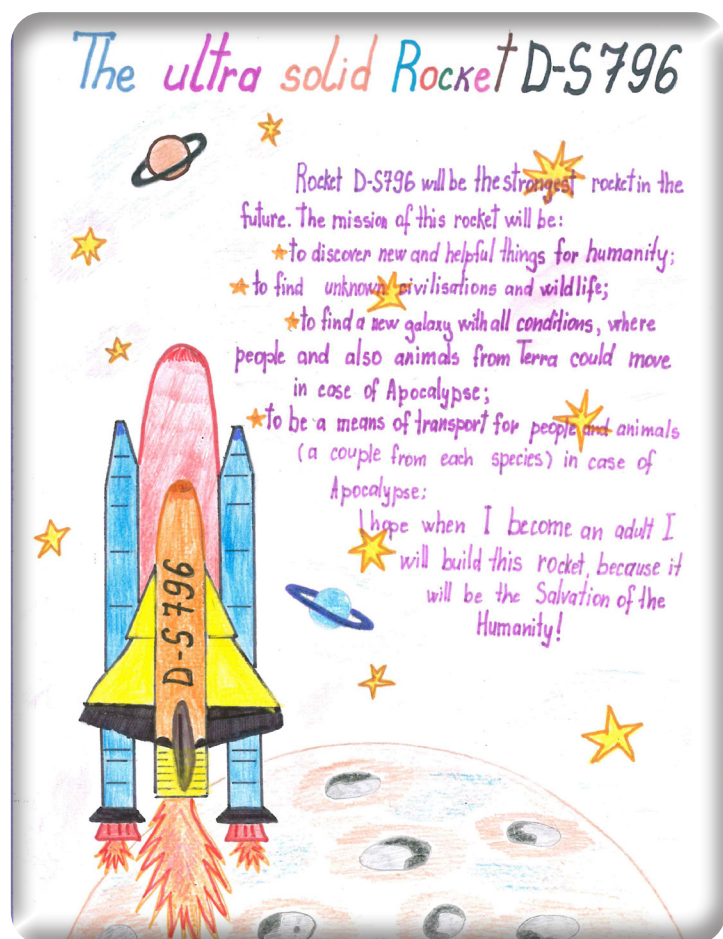

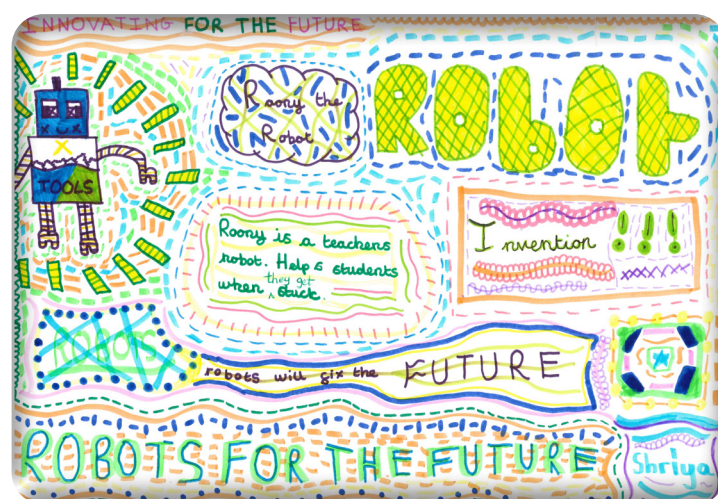
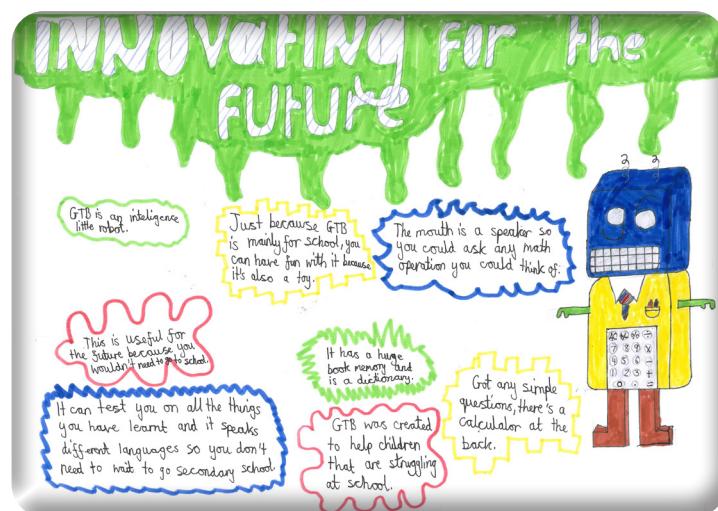
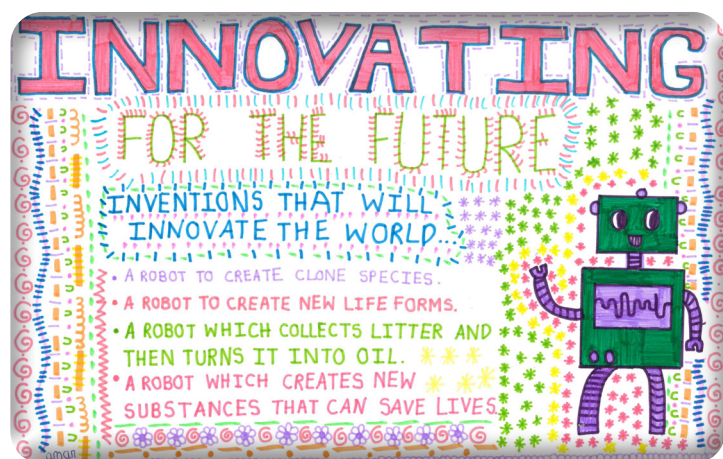




## Poster Competition – My Future Innovation
