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## The Art of Science



This term, Year 4 have been studying Pointillism. Pointillism is a technique of painting where tiny dots of colour are put close together to create an image. When you step close to the dots, you can clearly see the separate colours. As you get further away from the painting, the colours seem to mix together. Our remote learners and those in school actively enjoy using this technique in Art to create various images weekly.









## The Rainforests



The Year 3 children have been exploring the causes and consequences of deforestation of rainforests in Geography. One of their key skills is to use the world map to locate areas of rainforests and ask geographical questions. During the series of lessons, the children were able to name and locate on a map, the countries where rainforests are found and explore the cause and effect of deforestation in those areas. From this unit, the children will further understand how human actions can affect the environment and discuss the impact that they can have.

Safer Internet Day will be celebrated globally on Tuesday 9th February, promoting a safer and a more responsible use of online technology by children and young people across the world.

### **Alliance Groups**

At Hewens Primary, all children are placed in an alliance group which is a shared community to develop team building and competitive skills. Our four alliances are named after famous persons and are assoiciated with special colours, namely: Aldrin (Buzz Aldrin), represented by the colour blue, Columbus (Christopher Columbus), represented by the colour yellow, Garrett Anderson (Elizabeth Garrett Anderson), represented by the colour green and MacArthur (Dame Ellen MacArthur), represented by the colour red.

The alliance points system is used to motivate pupils in their learning and encourage them to follow the 6Rs of being respectful, responsible, resilient, rational, resourceful and reflective. Alliances compete each week to collect the most points and the winner is announced in class or at our weekly Achievement Assembly. Pupils can gain points for taking part in class and school-wide initiatives. In addition, pupils can be awarded their own personal alliance points which are recorded over the course of an academic year and can be a deciding factor on qualifying for trips, special prizes and winning awards.

Alliance Captains and Vice Captains are selected from the Year 6 cohort through an application process. They work closely with the School's Leadership Team, School Council representatives and the student body to promote engagement across school.
