## World Science Day - Tuesday 10th November

It also underlines the importance and relevance of science in our daily lives. During this year, at the time when the global coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic further demonstrated the critical role of science in addressing global challenges, the focus of the World Science Day is on Science for and with Society.

On Tuesday 10th November, Hewens Primary will be celebrating World Science Day by engaging pupils in various engrossing science experiments related to their topic of study. They will ask relevant questions and use different types of scientific enquiries to answer them.

#### Remembrance Day - Wednesday 11th November
