
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Design and Technology (DT)

The Year 5 classes have been focusing on American Cuisine in Design and Technology for Autumn One. The topic is closely linked to their Geography unit entitled 'From Hayes to USA'. Pupils were tasked to prepare a classic American dish to which they all chose to make the popular apple pies. Following a recipe, the pupils had to show an understanding and follow hygiene and safety rules for cooking to reduce the chances of accidents and help keep any germs out of their food. They were seen measuring out ingredients accurately and mixing them using the techniques stated in the recipe. There was much excitement as they all rolled out the pastry to the required thickness to put on the finishing touch on the apple pies before baking them in the oven.









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Sweets Containing Psychoactive Ingredients

To ensure your application arrives on time and in order to give your child the best possible chance of being offered the school of your choice, we would advise that you submit your applications no later than Friday 23rd October to ensure that it is received by the published deadline. You will have received information with regard to applying for your child starting secondary school via email, if you do not receive this, please check that we have your correct email address on the system.

We would like to inform all parents, guardians and carers of children born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 that the closing date for applications for Primary School places to be received by the London Borough of Hillingdon, by post or online, is midnight on **Friday 15th January 2021**. To ensure your application arrives on time and in order to give your child the best possible chance of being offered the school of your choice, we would advise that you submit your applications prior to the Christmas holiday period.
