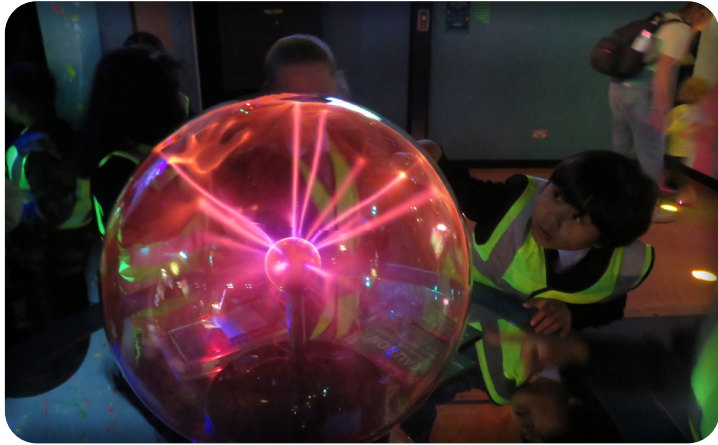
## The Look Out Discovery Centre Visit
